

Dr.Dre is the best producer in the Hip-Hop industry. He helped incorporate "Gangsta Rap" into the mainstream. At the same time he brought artists such Snoop Dogg, 2Pac, D.O.C. Eminem, and his group N.W.A. (consisting of himself, Ice Cube, MC Ren, DJ Yella, Eazy E, and at one time Arabian Prince.) into the limelight. He even spent many years primarily focusing on the other artists music. Some of these artists include: Mary J. Blige, Gwen Stefani, 50 Cent, The Game, Raekwon, and Jay-Z.

Dr.Dre was born Andre Romelle Young in 1965 to aspiring teenage singers Theodore and Verna Young. Both 17 and 16 at that time. About the time that Dre was in Junior high, gang violence in the neighborhood compelled him to transfer schools. In his later years he joined the group the "World Class Wreckin' Cru". His position in said group made him a local celebrity. Dre was also very confident in his skills on the turntable; often referring to himself as the "Master of Mixology" Their first hit "Surgery" was also immensely popular selling 50,000 copies in the Compton area. They undoubtedly soon became stars in the electro hop genre/scene that dominated the 1980's hip hop scene on the West Coast. He later dropped out of high-school to focus on the Cru. Dre, and DJ Yella even mixed on a local radio show, and obviously the station received a massive ratings boost during the time the duo was mixing. This all continued until

In 1986 Dre meet Ice Cube; the two instantly became friends. They later wrote songs for Ruthless Records, headed by Eazy E (which he founded with drug money). Later forming N.W.A. (Acronym for Niggaz Wit Attitudes) with Eazy, Cube, MC Ren, Yella, and himself. N.W.A. would be infamous for pioneering Gangsta Rap, a subgenre that heavy with profanity and controversy, with gritty and realistic depictions of street life in the inner-city. The group's first official album "Straight Outta Compton" was propelled into popularity with songs like "Fucktha Police" and "Gangsta Gangsta". Even without major radio play or touring it was phenomenally popular N.W.A. knew that people have been saying F.T.P. for years but couldn't help but say it themselves. N.W.A. isn't really an activist group. As Eazy said "I don't think anything's gonna help the problem. It's too dead. N.W.A.'s just being brutally honest." F.T.P. was rather explicit in it's lyrics saying things such as "They have the authority to kill a minority" Sadly this is true even today with cases of the murder of Trayvon Martin. Later in 1989 Cube split due to financial issues. Having wrote most of the lyrics, He thought he wasn't getting enough money. N.W.A later dropped a LP "Efil4zaggin" (look at it backwards) in 1991, Dre split the same year under advice from The D.O.C. Dre then founded Death Row records; with the help of super scary Suge Knight. Dre worked tirelessly to create The Chronic; his first solo album. With the strength of it's singles it elevated it's popularity in unimaginable ways. The early 1990's became controlled by "G-funk". The Chronic became a massive success. It went multi-platinum, ranked 6th as the best-selling album, Dr.Dre was named 8th best selling musical artist, and "Ain't Nuthing But a G Thang" grabbed 11th top selling single. Dre spent a copious amount of time afterward helping out Snoop Dogg and Ice Cube. In 1995 he signed 2Pac on the label. 2Pac sadly died in 1996,

After some rumors of Suge's corruption, Dre split and founded Aftermath. Dre thought we would bid farewell to Gangsta Rap. He did so with the solo track, "Been There, Done That". Inevitably; it flopped hard. The turning point of Aftermath's fate is when Dr.Dre signed Eminem in 1998. With Dre's help Em dropped "The Slim Shady LP" in 1999. Dre's album 2001 dropped the same year. Dre himself claimed "That it is so good it should be listened to for 3 years." Dre collaborated with many artists for 2001, Like Nate Dogg, Xzibit, and Hittman. 2001 was immensely successful, even more then The Chronic. It was 2nd on the billboard 200 charts.

From 2000 on Dre focused performing musical surgery other artists. He signed an R&B singer known as Truth Hurts. Helped produce singles for Mary J. Blige and Gwen Stefani.

Continued to assist with the music on Em's next 3 albums Even signed 50 Cent in 2003 with his hit album "Get Rich or Die Tryin'" He operated with Snoop with the "Blue Carpet Treatment" (album). While helping other rappers such as Raekwon and Young Buck, and other artists such as Justin Timberlake. He even produced a documentary for The Game.

Dre did such things until 2009, until he realized that it might be a good idea to release that patient he said he's been working on since around 2002 (Detox). Detox is supposed to somewhat of a concept album. But has many rappers confirmed to be on said album, for example RZA, Warren G, and Jay-Z. Although there were still many delays; like Em's next album Relapse. Two singles finally dropped in 2010, "Kush" and "I Need a Doctor". "The Psycho" single is set to drop in 2012. The same year Detox is expected to be let out of the operating room. After Dre's final album is released, Dre is going to focus on selling Beats by Dre, headphones crafted by the Master of Mixology. Inevitably Dre is still going to help artists with their music as well.

Tim McIlrath, lead singer, rhythm guitarist and frontman of the punk rock group Rise Against, is from Indianapolis, Indiana, USA. He was born November 3rd, 1979. As a child, he grew up in a middle class family. In middle school, Tim was bullied for having heterochromia, a mutation of the eye that causes the irises to be two different colours; in his case, brown and green. Other students saw this to be "a sign of the beast". As he grew out of middle school, he became more and more popular in the local Chicago punk scene, eventually starting a career in music.

Though Tim McIlrath hasn't changed the world, he's well on his way to doing so through his music and lifestyle – as a vegetarian, edging towards vegan, being straight edge (abstaining from addictive substances associated with the punk scene, such as recreational drugs, alcohol and cigarettes, sometimes even caffeine, promiscuous sex and prescription drugs.), supporting animal rights and anti-bullying. He finds these causes important because, well, animals have rights and also because he feels bullying hasn't been addressed properly in the rock scene.

Make It Stop (September's Children) is Rise Against's music video concerning bullying. Filmed at Tim's previously mentioned middle school, in which he was once bullied, the plot follows four students who are tormented to the point of suicide because of their sexual orientation. The song itself was supposedly written as a response to Tim discovering the It Gets Better Campaign – a non-profit organization supporting the LGBT community, who collaborated with Rise Against in the making of the video.

So, is Tim McIlrath an international superstar? Not really. But is he making a difference? Definitely. Every little bit counts when it comes to standing for the things we believe in.
