My name is Riel and I am a Grade 10 student from While I believe your government has been doing a generally admirable job thus far in governing the province, I would like to add support to the many who have already complained over your government's short-sighted decision to end the Saskatchewan Film Employment Tax Credit.

As an aspiring film producer who has belonged to several movie-production clubs in the past, as well as presently owning my own independent film company and belonging to one run by a friend, I feel the end of the credit cripples producers and makes the province seem provincial. The credit has helped shows such as CBC's Little Mosque on the Prairie, and CTV's Corner Gas — perhaps one of Canada's greatest comedies of all time, syndicated in 26 countries and you, Wall, had even guest-starred in an episode — both popular shows that have garnered much attention toward the province, get produced in Saskatchewan. At a time when Saskatchewan's reputation has been improving — we have the two fastest-growing cities in Canada, large reserves in potash, uranium, and fossil-fuels, quite possibly reserves of gold and diamonds — a strong film industry really benefits the province. It provides "free advertising and promotion" and enhances Saskatchewan's profile among the movers and shakers of New York and California. In addition, it creates jobs in a way that is environmentally friendly.

I would like to see the tax credit re-instated – my voice added to those of big celebrities like Brent Butt, Kim Coates, and Hunger Games film star Wes Bentley (the Hunger Games a movie receiving critical acclaim and grossing more than \$200 million at the box office) as well as the husband and wife producers of the award-winning animated Wapos Bay. While it cost the province \$8 million a year and \$100 million over its 14 year run, I believe the province has gained much more than \$100 million back in combined wealth and advertising, and, now, with the prospering province, it would likely help find Saskatchewan greater success. While you have said you intend to find an "alternative" method to replace the credit, you could, at the very least, guarantee that the credit remains in place until you have consulted with the industry and come up with an alternative that helps it the way the credit does. And until then, please, reinstate the credit. Thank you.
