Billy Bishop

Billy Bishop was born in Owen Sound Ontario in 1894 and died at palm beach Florida 1956. Billy Bishop was a Canadian War hero. Bishops parents were William A. and Margret Bishop, he was the second of three children. Growing up, Billy was dishonest and his grades were very low. He went to Royal Military College at the age of 17 and failed his first year because he was caught cheating on a test.

William fought in WWI. He started in the trenches and he hated it because he said that he wanted a clean death and in the air he would have a much cleaner death. Later, Billy joined the Royal Flying Corps but, there was room left in school so he started as an observer. He first fought for the British but later he fought for Canada.

Billy Bishop got many awards including the Victoria Cross, the Companion of the Order of Bath, Distinguished Service Order and Bar, Military Cross, Distinguished Flying Cross, the Canadian Efficiency Decoration, and Mention in Dispatches. Bishop deserved the award because he shot down 72 enemy planes. Also he fought from 1914-1918 and recruited people for the Flying Corps from 1938-1944.

After the war Billy married Timothy Eaton's granddaughter and together they had a son. He started a business with Billy Bishop. Later Bishop became an oil executive. He helped out in WWI by recruiting young people to the Royal Flying Corps. People will remember Bishop as the boy who would never miss and his courage in the early morning.
