The details of King Arthurs story are mainly composed of folklore and literary invention, and his historical existence is debated and disputed by modern day historians. The movie does not clearly explain the back ground of King Arthur or the war against the Saxons but it does show us the time in which he is believed to have lived and his fabled search for the Holy Grail. The Holy Grail is a sacred object figuring into literature and certain christian traditions. It is believed to be a cup used by Christ at the last supper that was later in the keeping of St. Joseph of Arimathea. The novel <u>Parvana's Journey</u> by Deborah Ellis is a great novel to read, because it talks about a situation in Afghanistan. Village members say some very cruel things to her, but Kira pushes it aside and focuses on the task at hand. Her disability also causes her to work harder at things that other people do easily, and cause Kira to shine. Kira's strength makes her admirable because, it proves that minority people or groups can overcome majority groups no matter how large they may be.

Although people cause Kira to fail occasionally, people also help her to succeed.

There are a lot of people who try and make life harder for Kira, but there are just as many who want to help her, like her friends Matt and Thomas. They provide Kira with

By learning this lesson, Kira applies it to other people in her life and encourages them to become the best they can be, like Jo. Kira's encouragement and support towards others makes her admirable, because it showcases her strong relationships and her unselfish nature.

Lowry proves that admirable people come in all forms, and that those who face limitations, like Kira, are even more admirable. By being strong Kira shows the reader that inner strength is just as important as being physically strong. Inner strength is what

makes you physically do things and without inner strength we would not push ourselves to reach a higher standard. The encouragement Kira shows throughout the novel, provides the reader with the knowledge to support those they love. Kira also teaches the reader to appreciate the encouragement they receive from others and not to take it for granted. Her observant nature lets the reader know that things are not what they always seem and you have to question to find out the truth. Kira is an excellent character because she realizes the deceitful nature of the village, and becomes a symbol of truth for not only the reader, but the future villagers.
