PERSUASIVE LETTER - LEVEL 2

- Context: Inconsistent language. A basic text – not totally clear.
- Message: Has a thesis. Tone is inconsistent. Somewhat convincing, not well developed.
- Strategies: Some attention to detail. Transitions usually support the flow of ideas.
- Pragmatic Cues: Tone and voice at times more argumentative than persuasive.
- Textual Cues: Inconsistent. Some variety of sentence openers. Basic connecting words.
- Syntactic: Some variety of sentences. Uses basis openers.
- Semantic/Lexical/Morphological/Graphophonical: Limited use of literary devices.

- Context: Inconsistent language use. Basic written text but not at a clear or correct level.
- Message: Support is adequate but not strong. Tone not consistent throughout. Vague examples.
- Pragmatic Cues: Language consistently appropriate. Tone not consistently respectful, sometimes aggressive.
- Textual Cues: Logical sequence of ideas.
- Syntactic: Basic sentences. Inconsistent capitalization and spelling.

PERSUASIVE LETTER - LEVEL 3

- Context: Create with clarity a persuasive letter. Well developed in logical order.
- Message: Well developed expository that states a purpose. It follows an organizational pattern. The ending needs to be stronger – sum it up.
- Strategies: Considers purpose and evidence and communicates meaning.
- Pragmatic Cues: The tone and voice are appropriate for the purpose of writing.
- Textual Cues: Logical/basic sequence of ideas are apparent.
- Syntactic: Uses basic sentence structure.
- Semantic/Lexical/Morphological/Graphophonical: Uses words that are appropriate but basic. Some use of imagery with word choice.

- Pragmatic Cues: Respectful appropriate language.
- Textual Cues: Logical sequence.
- Syntactic: Clear sentences. Some commas missing in last sentence.
- Semantic/Lexical/Morphological/Graphophonical: Some words not appropriate for audience “bestest”.

- Context: Thoughtful.
- Message: Insightful! Individuality, creativity and original text with engaging text. Purposeful – provides facts, reasons. Sincere. Presents point of view.
- Strategies: Thoughtful use of prior knowledge and experience; creative enriching detail. Considers purpose, audience, well-organized, wonderful transitions, i.e. "cutting the lawn".
- Pragmatic Cues: Engaging, respectful voice and tone.
- Textual Cues: Multi-paragraph. Logical sequence.
- Syntactic: Clear sentence structure, complete sentence structure, variety of sentence beginnings. Missing some commas with subordinate clauses.
- Semantic/Lexical/Morphological/Graphophonical: "I do get your point", "cautious about", "say farewell".

- Pragmatic Cues: Good opening paragraph to explain purpose.
- Textual Cues: Logical sequence.
- Syntactic: Clear sentences. Excellent sentence variety.
- Semantic/Lexical/Morphological/Graphophonical: Excellent word choice.
