Bus-ride to heroism

At 1:30 am on October 11, 1975, a nearly fatal accident left most spectators panicked, except for one.

24-year-old nurse Jody Stevens was on a bus from North Bay, Ontario to Toronto to visit her family for thanksgiving and to celebrate her birthday, when she saw it. Up ahead the road of Highway 11, a line of cars was all stopped.

Quick thinking told her that it must have been an accident.

She raced ahead to the scene in the soaking rain, and what she saw she would never forget.

"It's pretty much been imprinted in the back of my mind, that image of all that blood and those two moose, and all that wreckage." Jude recalls "This guy tells me he thinks they're all dead and I knew I had to act fast."

Lying sideways in the ditch was an old school bus converted to a camper. The bodies of two moose hung out from the back of a hunters truck stalled in the left lane and a silver Mercedes Benz with a smashed hood was on the right shoulder, but that left a silent ring of stunned bystanders was a blue 1973 ford, four people inside the crumpled mess.

Charles Jodouin, 26, and his wife Jeanne and her parents, Omer and Lucie Fortin were off to Kingston to visit Jeanne's sister. Traffic was fairly heavy despite how late it was, and the left rear wheel spun off of the school bus and flew straight into the grill of an oncoming pickup truck. It skidded across the center and crashed into the Jodouins. The Mercedes, which was travelling behind the camper lost control and crashed into it too.

All of them were trapped inside of the car, all unconscious except Lucie Fortin, who was deep in shock and talking incoherently. Jody felt their pulses and determined that they were all alive.

She requested the help of bystanders and conjured life jackets and diapers to treat the injured victims. She was quickly able to bandage and seal Omer's hear injury with the diapers and some fishing line.

Lucie was now screaming, so she asked some nearby men to comfort her.

Finally, police and ambulance arrived, who were unaware at the time that Jody was a nurse.

Her previous suspicions of Omer having heart problems were proved nearly correct when it was discovered that he suffered from high blood pressure.

All survived their injuries, not knowing their rescuers name almost a year later, but were grateful.

"We do not know her name, but we are all thankful for our guardian angel." said Lucie Fortin a year later.

Jody received recognition for her courage and heroism with the Ontario Provincial Polices Commissioners Citation.

"Bravery and altruism are the real factors that aided the victims through this difficulty" comments Officer Bobby Robertson.
