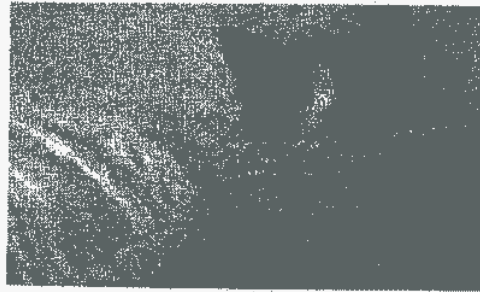

The first nations and early settlers had different stuff then we have today. The early settlers and first nations had different house then we do now. I would not like to live in the olden. days because I need space in my house.

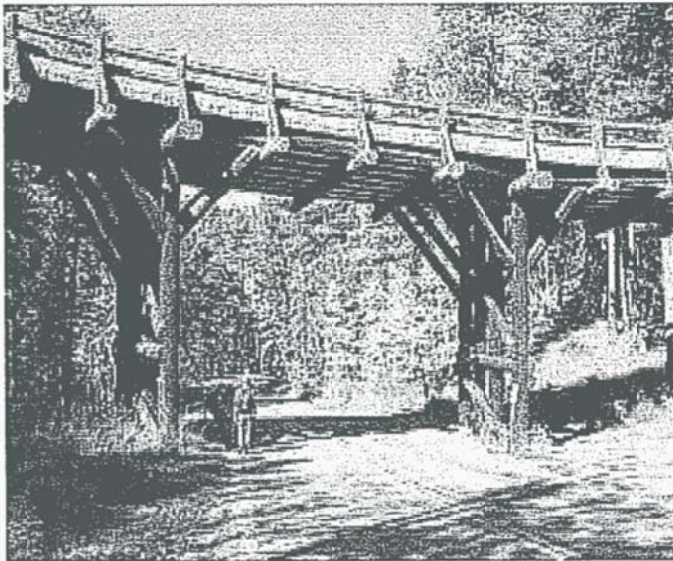





Volcano Facts


