- Fransaskois Concert



- We also hosted the Student Leadership Experience in September 2022 at Dallas Valley Ranch Camp north of Lumsden. The experience was attended by 19 university students from across Saskatchewan and Canada with five post-secondary institutions represented. Saskatchewan UNESCO Associated Schools Project Network
