Many quit to avoid being exposed. Some committed suicide as a result. In the 1980s, victims of the Purge fought back with a class-action suit against the government that helped shed light on the systemic discrimination that members of the LGBTQ2+ community faced from the government and the rest of society. In 2017, the federal government issued a formal apology on behalf of the government and Canadian society for the treatment of members of the LGBTQ2+ community.





Summary: Comment motiver ses élèves? Pourquoi les mêmes erreurs se répètent-elles dans leurs travaux? Comment faire pour que les leçons soient mémorisées durablement, même une fois les évaluations terminées? Comment redonner le goût d'apprendre aux élèves? Tant de questions se posent en enseignement. Céline Fouquet désire aider les personnes enseignantes du préscolaire et du primaire à mieux comprendre les facteurs qui agissent sur la réussite de leurs élèves. En s'appuyant sur les recherches en neurosciences, en psychologie cognitive et en sciences de l'éducation, elle

leur propose des pistes de réflexion et d'actions pour soutenir chaque apprenant dans le développement de son plein potentiel. En première partie de l'ouvrage, elle lève le voile sur le fonctionnement du cerveau, passe en revue les leviers des apprentissages efficaces et suggère des pratiques pédagogiques à privilégier pour favoriser l'engagement. Elle y traite entre autres des rétroactions constructives, de la curiosité comme moteur de l'apprentissage, de l'erreur comme signal d'information ainsi que de l'entraînement de l'attention et de l'inhibition. Dans la deuxième partie, l'autrice explique le fonctionnement de la mémoire et présente six clés pour se souvenir plus durablement des informations apprises telles que la mobilisation des connaissances préalables, l'optimisation de la mémoire de travail et les stratégies de mémorisation efficace. Une dernière partie regroupe cinq séquences d'activités pour transmettre les notions aux élèves : comprendre la plasticité du cerveau, maîtriser son attention, apprendre à s'arrêter pour réfléchir, se tester ou espacer les réactivations pour mieux mémoriser. Des questionnaires, des affiches et des fiches d'activités accompagnent l'ouvrage. En mettant les neurosciences au service de la pédagogie, les enseignantes et les enseignants pourront faire des choix éclairés, que ce soit lors de la planification des activités d'enseignement-apprentissage ou à l'occasion des interventions en classe.

# ?: mieux enseigner les stratégies de compréhension et de justification en lecture

Summary: Pour bien comprendre un texte, les élèves doivent utiliser une variété de stratégies que l'enseignant leur aura enseignées. Et pour que l'enseignant puisse bien évaluer leur compréhension, il doit aussi leur enseigner à élaborer des réponses pertinentes et bien justifiées, à l'oral ou à l'écrit. Cet ouvrage a comme objectif de conjuguer les stratégies de compréhension en lecture et les stratégies de justification. L'autrice vise en quelque sorte à déconstruire la perception classique de l'enseignement de la lecture en "question/réponse". Elle outille l'enseignant pour qu'il enseigne

explicitement à mieux s'exprimer à la suite d'une lecture, à justifier les réponses (accompagnement, modelage, rétroaction, guidage, étayage...). En plus des stratégies à enseigner pour chacune des sphères de la lecture (identification de mots, compréhension, réponse), l'autrice présente des activités concrètes, signifiantes et faciles à mettre en application, tant au préscolaire qu'à chacun des cycles du primaire. L'ouvrage présente plusieurs suggestions d'albums jeunesse pertinents pour différents dispositifs de lecture. L'autrice suggère aussi des liens vers des vidéos complémentaires qu'elle a créés dans le cadre de son travail. Enfin, il contient du matériel reproductible en couleurs et en noir (affiches, cartes, signets, grilles pour l'évaluation...).
